## Special Education Funding

We have three primary streams of revenue.

- Federal Contributions: Legislated at up to 40% of per pupil expenditure. Remains at around 14%. (3.5 million 16%)
- State Contributions: Legislated at 92% excess cost, last year 81.4%. This year at 78.2%. (11.9 million, 55%)
- Local Contributions: Provides the difference needed to run the organization. (6.1 million, 29%)

Funding Education is Key for the future of Kansas-----Make a difference in November elections!

### Interlocal Budget and Funding

- This school year, (2019/2020) and the past school year, (2018/2019) Interlocal State Categorical Aid was cut just over \$300,000.
- Federal dollars are down around \$20,000 dollars annually.
- Assessments to districts are increasing and will likely continue to do so.
  - 4% increase in June of 2019
  - 6% increase in July of 2019

### **Fiscal Planning**

- Cost savings strategies were employed at the end of this past school year.
  - Employee Assistance Program put on hold.
  - Realigned staff to cover vacant positions.
  - Reduced contracted services, (Project Alternative, Contract Nursing, Speech Tele-therapy)
  - Deeper analysis of para hires.
- Increased Medicaid Efforts.
- Collaborative planning with our member districts in long term solutions for district assessments.

### How Can You Help?----Advocate for your Profession!

- Know the issues around special education funding.
- State Statute (K.S.A. 72-3422) provides for special education funding to be at 92% excess cost. Currently at 78.2%.
- Federal law, Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) calls for 40% of excess costs. Current Federal funding is at 14.6%.
  - There is legislation introduced by Kansas Senator Pat Roberts to fully fund IDEA.
  - S.866.....as of 8/1/19 the bill had been read twice and moved to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

- A report must be made if there is reason to suspect that a child has been harmed as a result of physical, mental, emotional, neglect, or sexual abuse
- It is your duty to report and DCF's duty to investigate. You do not need to know all the facts to make a report



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
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

### CHANGES FOR 2019-20

- . KSDE is merging the IDEA Requirements File Review and the Gifted File Review!
- The merging of these two reviews is an effort to streamline the file review process for both KSDE staff and also for LEA staff. Combining the two will <u>create one set</u> <u>of questions (22 total)</u>, one set of emails and reminders, and one staff contact person for file review.
- The combined file review will include the <u>same number of files</u>, just combined; 6 files of students who are gifted (2 elementary, 2 middle, and 2 HS) and 10-20 files for students with disabilities, depending on size of district.

- Evaluations are required for all 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> year, 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> year, and "on cycle" employees
- Certified (Teaching) staff: In cooperation with SKIEA, this tool was modified (2018) to be more useful, efficient, and appropriate with special education teacher job description.
- ✤ 7 steps (Twice for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year employees)
- School Psychologists and Related Service providers will continue to use the same evaluation process as they have in the past




### **Emergency Safety Intervention: ESI**

- ESI: The use of seclusion or physical restraint
- For you or your staff, <u>www.myinfintec.org</u> has more in-depth training videos with example scenarios.
- If you know or anticipate you will be working with a student that you may use an emergency safety intervention, please seek Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) training through the Interlocal.
- CPI Training: Once trained initially, you may renew within one year, and then <u>subsequent renewals will only be required every other year</u>
